This training is designed for community service providers (e.g., peer advocates, early care workers, nurses, case managers, clinicians) of all levels who serve children aged 0-5 and their families. In the morning, participants will be given an overview of core beliefs and practices, including a history of the field, common services, data on why the early years matter and a brief introduction to Reflective Practice. The afternoon will focus on methods and interventions used by practitioners across multiple disciplines. Participants will be given tools on how to screen, refer and discuss Infant Mental Health Services to families and other providers. Special emphasis will be given to abuse prevention and families involved with the child welfare system.
